REMEMBERING THE PORTLAND:

125 YEARS OF LEGACY AND LEARNING

On November 26, 1898, the elegant coastal steamship *Portland* departed Boston, never to reach its intended destination. All passengers and crew were lost. The ship's location remained a mystery for a century until researchers determined its resting place. Since 2002, the site has become a focus for maritime studies, ranging from technical science to elementary education.

Join us as we commemorate the 125th anniversary and explore innovative technologies and new findings while also focusing on the personal stories tied to this historic New England maritime tragedy.
